	Read the entire chapter of Daniel 6. What is your reaction to the whole story recorded in this passage?
5.	Sometimes Christians allow themselves to get comfortable with their "Babylonian" environment instead of seeing themselves as "aliens and strangers in the world". How can you keep the biblical focus of First Peter 2:11-12 in view?
