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1.	Many people these days concede that God is holy, but they have trouble understanding why God would have to punish people who are not. How do you respond to that question?		
	When you think about your own life (past and present), and then you ponder God's perfection and absolute purity, how do you feel? (Think this through without the benefit of the cross!)		
	How different are those feelings from the ones you acquire when you compare your life with the lives of other people. Why is it so important that God <i>alone</i> be our standard of comparison?		
2.	Read Ezekiel 33:11 and 2 Peter 3:9. How does this help balance the characterization often made of the "vengeful God" of the Bible?		
	Write out a response to God for providing Noah's ark, then and now. What does the ark tell you about God?		
	To put it in terms of Genesis 7, it is critically important that you know that you have really entered the ark! Are you sure? If not, get in it now by repenting of your sins and placing your full and complete confidence in the life, substitutionary death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ.		
3.	According to 2 Peter 2:7-8 Lot struggled to live righteously in an unrighteous place. How are you doing at this? In what areas do you struggle?		
	What will you do to insure that these areas of struggle don't turn into areas of defeat in your quest to live righteously?
