

## **Application Questions**

These questions are provided for your further study and application of today's message. Thoughtfully writing out the answers to these questions will help to drive home the point of today's message. It is also helpful to discuss your answers with others. This can take place with friends, your family, accountability partners, or ministry groups within the church.

1. In the rare event that sex is discussed in church, it is usually in some of its most negative contexts (and there are plenty). But such a one-sided slant is unfortunate, considering the Bible's many positive reviews on this divinely instituted act. Describe how your view of sex has gone through changes since you became a Christian. In what ways (even small ones) have you "thrown the baby out with the bath water" in hopes of adopting a righteous perspective?

How far would your perspective need to move if you were to think about sex the way God intended Adam to think about sex when he inaugurated the activity in the Garden of Eden, or the way the inspired book, *Song of Solomon*, portrays it?

2. What impact do you think it would have on your marriage if you began to think more "redemptively" (biblically positive) about sex?

How important is attitude when it comes to sex? Why?

- 3. What practical steps can you take to make your sexual encounters more of a divinely sanctioned ministry to your spouse?
- 4. Utilizing a setting and a time conducive to a level-headed discussion, talk to your spouse this week about this sermon (its three points) and your sex life.
