

Application Questions

These questions are provided for your further study and application of today's message. Thoughtfully writing out the answers to these questions will help to drive home the point of today's message. It is also helpful to discuss your answers with others. This can take place with friends, your family, accountability partners, or ministry groups within the church.

1. Understanding, embracing and proclaiming the proper biblical response to the gospel is obviously of utmost importance. Unfortunately most churchgoers only traffic in Sunday School sound bytes and the opinions of their friends. The current confusion among Christians today is understandable when so many fail to go to God's revealed source to get the right information. What are some of the unbiblical, reductionist, truncated, oversimplified or whimsical responses to the gospel that you have heard presented, pitched or discussed by others?

What will you do this week to make sure that your understanding of repentance and faith are truly biblical?

2. How does knowing that God is active in graciously granting repentance and faith impact your thinking about evangelism?
