2. For many Christians, worship is relegated to a few songs on Sunday. How much real worship and honor would you say you offer to Jesus between church services? Why isn't it more?

Read **Hebrews 13:15**. What will you do this week to fill your weekdays with praise and worship?

3. Describe some of the implications for your daily life of the fact that Christ's redemptive work on the cross was fully and completely accomplished.

What difference does it make that Jesus' work (and not your own) has made you totally and absolutely acceptable before a holy, righteous and just God?
