

Application Questions

- 1. Read **Revelation 21:1-5**. What is it about our ultimate home that you are looking forward to the most? Why?
- 2. Read 1 Peter 3:15. How would your rate your preparedness?

Reread **1 Peter 3:15** and consider that doubt is when we "ask" ourselves about these issues. How often does that happen in your mind? About what aspects of your hope?

- 3. What will you to do dig deeper into the accounts of Christ's life and ministry?
- 4. What would you say to someone who claimed that "faith" is supposed to mean that we don't have or shouldn't need any "reasons" for our future hope?
- 5. If your pastor called you today and asked you to present a case before a group of skeptics at the local community center regarding the truthfulness of Christ's resurrection, what would your basic outline look like?
