

## Hebrews 9:1-11

<sup>1</sup> Now the first covenant had regulations for worship and also an earthly sanctuary. <sup>2</sup> A tabernacle was set up. In its first room were the lampstand, the table and the consecrated bread; this was called the Holy Place. <sup>3</sup> Behind the second curtain was a room called the Most Holy Place, 4 which had the golden altar of incense and the gold-covered ark of the covenant. This ark contained the gold jar of manna, Aaron's staff that had budded, and the stone tablets of the covenant. 5 Above the ark were the cherubim of the Glory, overshadowing the atonement cover. But we cannot discuss these things in detail now. 6 When everything had been arranged like this, the priests entered regularly into the outer room to carry on their ministry. 7 But only the high priest entered the inner room, and that only once a year, and never without blood, which he offered for himself and for the sins the people had committed in ignorance. 8 The Holy Spirit was showing by this that the way into the Most Holy Place had not yet been disclosed as long as the first tabernacle was still standing. 9 This is an illustration for the present time, indicating that the gifts and sacrifices being offered were not able to clear the conscience of the worshiper. 10 They are only a matter of food and drink and various ceremonial washingsexternal regulations applying until the time of the new order. 11 When Christ came as high priest of the good things that are already here, he went through the greater and more perfect tabernacle that is not man-made, that is to say, not a part of this

creation. (NIV)

## **Application Questions**

These questions are provided for your further study and application of today's sermon. Thoughtfully writing out the answers to these questions will help to drive home the point of today's study. It is also helpful when you are able to discuss your answers with others.

- 1. With the Old Testament in view Paul writes in 2 Timothy 3:16 that "all Scripture" is "useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness." Elsewhere Paul writes in Romans 10:4 that "Christ is the end of law." After this weekend's sermon, how do you harmonize the profitable study of the old covenant and Christ's fulfillment of old covenant?
- 2. Read **Deuteronomy 6:1-3**. When you begin to understand the breadth of "all" the old covenant's demands and requirements, how does it change your perspective on Christ's accomplishment of it on your behalf?
- 3. Read **Matthew 3:13-15**. Consider how Christ had us in mind when he did things like this. How does this text change the way you think about Jesus' choices during his earthly ministry?
- 4. How can our modern "unwritten rituals" begin to threaten our trust in Christ?
- 5. How has this week's sermon helped to modify or enhance the way you will read the Old Testament in the future?
- 6. Write out a prayer of thanksgiving for Christ's fulfillment of all of God's requirements.
