## **Application Questions**

- 4. The call to "be content with what we have" is often viewed as a negative command. But as God tells us in 1 Timothy 6:17 contentment includes a thoughtful "enjoyment" of the things he has given us. Describe how you might purposefully "enjoy" the material blessings God has granted you.
- 5. Of course, it is supremely important to cherish the Giver above the gifts. How is this done? What practical steps are involved in this important practice?
- 6. How sure are you that God will take care of you and provide what you really need? What difference should this assurance make in your daily life?
