Hebrews 13:8-16

⁸Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever. ⁹ Do not be carried away by all kinds of strange teachings. It is good for our hearts to be strengthened by grace, not by ceremonial foods, which are of no value to those who eat them. 10 We have an altar from which those who minister at the tabernacle have no right to eat. 11 The high priest carries the blood of animals into the Most Holy Place as a sin offering, but the bodies are burned outside the camp. 12 And so Jesus also suffered outside the city gate to make the people holy through his own blood. 13 Let us, then, go to him outside the camp, bearing the disgrace he bore. 14 For here we do not have an enduring city, but we are looking for the city that is to come. 15 Through Jesus, therefore, let us continually offer to God a sacrifice of praise—the fruit of lips that confess his name. 16 And do not forget to do good and to share with others, for with such sacrifices God is pleased. (NIV)

Application Questions

- 1. Read **2 Timothy 4:3**. How is the reality of this verse seen in our day? How would you gauge the modern appetite for aberrant teaching?
- 2. Read **2 Corinthians 11:3**. What would you say to the person who says he doesn't feel susceptible to any kind of false doctrines?

What can and should you do to stay vigilant and discerning in your quest to retain sound biblical doctrine?

3. While we are not tempted in the same way as the first century recipients of the Book of Hebrews to return to the "ceremonies" of the Old Testament temple worship, there *are* several "forms" in the modern Christian life that we encounter on a regular basis. Take a moment to list some of them (e.g., the Lord's Supper, singing songs in church, etc.)

Think of instances when you "went through the motions" of some Christian activity without engaging your mind and heart. What can you do to ensure that you personally and consciously engage in every aspect of your Christian life?

4. Read **Colossians 2:2-4**. Describe the current state of your personal Bible study and your progress in understanding theology and Christian doctrine. What will you do to step this up in the new year?
