²³ Then Jesus said to his disciples, "I tell you the truth, it is hard for a rich man to enter the kingdom of heaven. ²⁴ Again I tell you, it is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for a rich man to enter the kingdom of God." 25 When the disciples heard this, they were greatly astonished and asked, "Who then can be saved?" ²⁶ Jesus looked at them and said, "With man this is impossible, but with God all things are possible." Application Questions

These questions are provided for your further study and application of today's sermon. Thoughtfully writing out the answers to these questions will help to drive home the point of today's study. It is also helpful when you are able to discuss your answers with others.

1. Read **Luke 6:46**. What is your reaction to this verse?

How would you respond to someone who told you he wanted to be a Christian but he wasn't interested in letting Christ dictate what he does and does not do?

2. Read **1 Thessalonians 1:9** (keeping in mind the context of verse 5 – i.e., the reception of the gospel). Understanding that the Bible portrays "idolatry" as controlling priorities to which we give our allegiance, and things in which we put our ultimate trust (which helps us apply the concept of idolatry beyond the flannel graph images of bearded men bowing down to carved images), what were some of your "idols" before you became a genuine follower of Christ?

Read 2 Corinthians 5:15. Consider and describe how "self" related to all idolatry.

- 3. Read **1 John 5:21**. What are some of the "idols" which still seek your allegiance and trust as a Christian?
- 4. Write out a prayer that expresses your desire to have the Holy Spirit empower you to let God be your God and Christ your Lord.
