Application Questions

These questions are provided for your further study and application of today's sermon. Thoughtfully writing out the answers to these questions will help to drive home the point of today's study. It is also helpful when you are able to discuss your answers with others.

1. What is your assessment of those who say they love you but choose to willfully do what is contrary to your desires, values, standards and requests?

Obviously there are those who overtly reject God and his commands, but how have you witnessed your own inadvertent rejection of God as you pursued a sinful or compromised path? What can you learn from this connection?

2. Read **Proverbs 6:25-29**. Why is the perspective so radically different between the wise observer and the one embroiled in temptation?

How can this kind of foolish deception be identified in the "lesser sins" with which you grapple daily? In other words, identify some of the foolish and harmful consequences associated with materialism, gossip, laziness, etc.

3. Read **Hosea 9:7**. What current connections do you see between the sin in our culture and the disdain of biblical preachers and preaching?

4. How have you rationalized and excused your behavior and compromised God's truth by proceeding down a sinful path?

5. What can you do to keep the absurdity of sin in the forefront of your mind the next time you are hit with temptation?
