Before you became a Christian, what were some of the excuses that kept you from honestly and completely confessing your culpability and sin before God?

- Read Luke 6:39-42. Why is assessing others' failures so much easier than assessing your own?
- 4. How would you describe a situation in which a criminal who assaulted your daughter and carjacked her vehicle was allowed by the judge to keep your daughter's car and avoid any punishment because the lawyers argued that the criminal had periodically been seen doing good deeds in his neighborhood?

Why do you think people are so quick to assume their crimes against God's holiness will be overlooked because they can point to examples of "good deeds" in their lives?

5. Read Psalm 51:1-2 & 51:17. Spend a few minutes talking to God about your need for Christ, identifying and expressing some of the specific violations of God's law that you have committed. Rejoice in the forgiveness that comes by trusting in Christ!
