Romans 6:15-18

15 What then? Shall we sin because we are not under law but under grace? By no means! ¹⁶ Don't you know that when you offer yourselves to someone to obey him as slaves, you are slaves to the one whom you obey-whether you are slaves to sin, which leads to death, or to obedience, which leads to righteousness? ¹⁷ But thanks be to God that, though you used to be slaves to sin, you wholeheartedly obeyed the form of teaching to which you were entrusted. 18 You have been set free from sin and have become slaves to righteousness.

1. How would you respond to someone who says that the biblical phrase "not under law, but under grace" means that because Christians are forgiven we don't have to concern ourselves with doing what the Bible says?

2. Read **Proverbs 5:22** and **2 Peter 2:19**. How powerful can sin's dominance be in a person's life? How vigilant should we be about the addictive power of sin? What is at stake when we don't respect sin's power?

Read **James 1:14-15**. What practical help or encouragement could you provide a brother or sister in Christ who is feeling enticed by sin?

3. How does our daily, functional relationship with God factor in to our freedom from the enslavement to sinful behavior?

4. How can the biblical picture of our "redemption" and transference from one "master" (i.e., sin) to another (i.e., God and righteousness) help you in your battle with temptation?
