Application Questions

These questions are provided for your further study and application of today's sermon. Thoughtfully writing out the answers to these questions will help to drive home the point of today's study. It is also helpful when you are able to discuss your answers with others

- 1. Why is it actually *unloving* to conclude, as so many do today in our "Christian" culture, that if a person is "devoted to God" or "loves Jesus" then that person will probably be "alright" and is not in need of our evangelistic efforts?
- 2. Read Mark 1:15, Hebrews 6:1 and Acts 20:21. Clarify in your mind and succinctly write out why these two distinct components of the one biblical response to the gospel are each important to understand and communicate in our evangelism.
- 3. When asked, "Why should God accept you?" most people will answer, "Because I'm a good person" or "Because I'm trying to do what's right". How would you succinctly and biblically respond to this common misconception?
- 4. Read Luke 18:9-14. How do "lateral comparisons" feed our sinful tendencies to attempt to earn God's favor?
- 5. Why do you think so many people stumble over grace (i.e., God has provided all the righteousness necessary for salvation through the work of Christ)?
- 6. How would you respond to someone who claims that because of grace we can live however we want, without any real concern about God's rules?
