- 3. Read **Romans 1:1-5**. How does the resurrection of Christ and the reliablity of Scripture relate to the way Paul views obedience to Christ's teaching?
- 4. Read **1 Corinthians 15:42-49**. How does a passage like this encourage you concerning the future of those who trust in Christ?
- 5. If you are unable to sincerely and confidently celebrate the resurrection and its implications because you have reasonable doubts, what further investigation are you willing to do to settle this question? Which of the resources below will you commit to read or listen to first?
