- 1. Read **Jeremiah 29:4-7**. Knowing we are exiles and expatriates for Christ, how does this command to the Old Testament exiles in Babylon motivate you to pray for our country? What are some of the things you ought to be praying for more often as it relates to the welfare of our nation?
- 2. Read **Ecclesiastes 10:5-6**. Obviously there are times when godly people have to endure the "evil" of foolish people being appointed to "high places." What counsel would you give to another Christian that may help him tolerate such times without despair, hostility or disrespect?
- 3. It is not uncommon for Christians to harbor contempt and scorn toward their national or civic leaders because they feel their authority over them is undeserved. How should the truths of Romans 13 change that attitude?
- 4. Read **Colossians 3:22-25**. Most people's concern about the law extends to the point of what they can get away with. How would these workplace directives (if applied to our governmental authorities) change that for Christians?
- 5. What specific local or national laws do you plan to be more thoughtful of and vigilant about as a result of today's study?
