Application Questions

These questions are provided for your further study and application of today's sermon. Thoughtfully writing out the answers to these questions will help to drive home the point of today's study. It is also helpful when you are able to discuss your answers with others.

- 1. Read **Luke 12:35-38**. How often would you say that you thoughtfully envision the return of Christ, the end of this world, or the future inauguration of Christ's kingdom? Why do you think it isn't more often?
- 2. Read **1 John 3:2-3**. In your own words describe the relationship between "hoping for" the return of Christ and becoming more "purified" in your behavior. Why is there a cause-and-effect relationship between those two concepts for us as Christians?
- 3. Read **Acts 1:11** and **John 14:1-3**. What does a rereading of these familiar and straightforward promises from Jesus do to your heart, and how might they affect the values in your everyday life if they were more near the front of your mind?
- 4. Read **2 Peter 3:3-4**. How do modern-day mockers inhibit your focus on the return of Christ, or restrain your enthusiasm for the return of Christ?
- 5. Read **2 Peter 3:1-2**. What practical helps or reminders can you put in place daily to remind yourself that today could be the day of Christ's return?
