13 Therefore let us not pass judgment on one another any longer, but rather decide never to put a stumbling block or hindrance in the way of a brother. 14 I know and am persuaded in the Lord Jesus that nothing is unclean in itself, but it is unclean for anyone who thinks it unclean. 15 For if your brother is grieved by what you eat, you are no longer walking in love. By what you eat, do not destroy the one for whom Christ died. 16 So do not let what you regard as good be spoken of as evil. 17 For the kingdom of God is not a matter of eating and drinking but of righteousness and peace and joy in the Holy Spirit. 18 Whoever thus serves Christ is acceptable to God and approved by men. 19 So then let us pursue what makes for peace and for mutual upbuilding. 20 Do not, for the sake of food, destroy the work of God. Everything is indeed clean, but it is wrong for anyone to make another stumble by what he eats. 21 It is good not to eat meat or drink wine or do anything that causes your brother to stumble. (ESV)

Application Questions

- 1. Read **Romans 5:6-8** and **Philippians 2:3-8**. How can the example of Christ and how he loved us serve as a guide when we are making decisions about the "gray areas"?
- 2. Describe a situation in which you could easily imagine one Christian's exercise of freedom genuinely "tripping up" another Christian by emboldening him to participate in something that could very well violate his conscience or entice him into sin.
- 3. Read **James 1:14-15**. Not everyone's temptations are the same. What are some of your vulnerabilities or enticements about which you need to be extra vigilant, so as to not open yourself up to serious temptation?
- 4. Read **1 Corinthians 8:4-13**. What are some freedoms in your life that you need to reconsider for the sake of your brothers and sisters in Christ?
- 5. What approach would you take in responding to someone who tells you he is not going to limit his freedom just because someone else can't handle it?
