Application Questions

These questions are provided for your further study and application of today's sermon. Thoughtfully writing out the answers to these questions will help to drive home the point of today's study. It is also helpful when you are able to discuss your answers with others.

- 1. Read **Philippians 2:1-2**. Describe in your own words some of the strength and encouragement that can be derived from being a part of a fellowship of Christians who are truly unified in pursuing and serving Jesus Christ.
- 2. Read **Philippians 2:3-4**. While many assume a kind of idyllic unity should be easy and natural for Christians, what in Philippians 2:3-4 indicates that this will be a very difficult and at times an elusive goal?
- 3. Read **John 17:20-23**. Remembering that Paul's exhortation in Romans 15:5-7 is couched in a prayer, and that Christ is praying for our unity here in John 17, we should be impressed that prayer is an indispensible key to achieving the kind of unity the Bible is commanding. What will you do to remind yourself to regularly pray for the kind of biblical unity we studied this weekend?
- 4. Read **1 Corinthians 5:11** and **Titus 3:10**. How would you respond to someone who insists that as long as a person professes his love for Christ we should always seek to be unified with that person?
- 5. Read **Ephesians 4:1-3**. What aspect of these three verses provides the biggest challenge for you?
