- 1. Read **Psalm 73:12-14**. Even though you may be convinced it is not true, what are some of the situations you encounter that make you *feel* the feelings the psalmist expresses in these verses?
- 2. Read **1 Peter 2:20-23** and **Hebrews 12:3**. What were some of the most notable moments of restraint and trust that Christ demonstrated during his earthly ministry when he was unfairly and unjustly treated?
- 3. Read **2 Thessalonians 1:4-10**. While God's judgment on unrepentant sinners is unpleasant to consider, how does a reminder of it help you to keep doing what is right, especially when you are under attack?
- 4. Read **Matthew 5:10-12**. What are some of the situations in your life that reflect the truth of this passage? How does your identification with the prophets of the Old Testament keep you from retaliation?
- 5. Read **Psalm 16:8-11**. What are some of the oft-overlooked benefits of God's love and loyalty to you?
