- 4. Read **1 Corinthians 10:5-13**. How does the example of the circumstances surrounding the forty-year Israelite wandering help you to resist the temptations in your life today?
- 5. Read **Ezra 7:8-10**. What do we learn from a passage like this, when we see God turn a bad situation around for us, as he was doing for those Israelites who had been exiled in Babylon?
