Application Questions

- 3. Read Psalm 94:1-11. What would you say to someone who tells you he or she has never felt a strong desire for God to intervene with justice?
- 4. Read Romans 8:28 and Genesis 50:20. Describe an evil or injustice in your life that God has utilized for good.
- 5. Read **Psalm 139:23-24**. What are some of the tempations you encounter when you are suffering? What added instructions would you give to make this prayer sincere and meaningful to a Christian when he experiences an injustice?
