

- 1. The Church's Rite of Initiation:

 A. An "Ordinance"

 Water Baptism
 - "Ordinance" = Something "Ordered" or Commanded
 - "Sacrament" = a "Sacred" or Holy Practice
 - We prefer "ordinance" because of how "sacrament" is defined by the RCs

Catechism of the Catholic Church (1994)

§1250 "Born with a fallen human nature and tainted by original sin, children also have need of the new birth in Baptism to be freed from the power of darkness and brought into the realm of the freedom of the children of God, to which all men are called.

Catechism of the Catholic Church (1994)

"...The sheer gratuitousness of the grace of salvation is particularly manifest in infant Baptism. The Church and the parents would deny a child the priceless grace of becoming a child of God were they not to confer Baptism shortly after birth."

BC§117(a) "What are the principal ways of obtaining grace? The sacraments of Baptism and Penance were instituted chiefly to give grace to those who do not possess it; the other sacraments, to increase it in those who are already in the state of grace."

 - -- "the benefit is by the very fact of the action being performed"
 - -- Is there "power" in the ceremony itself?
 - > Jeremiah 9:25-26

- 1. The Church's Rite of Initiation:
 - A. An "Ordinance" Water Baptism



 - > The "clasm" (breaking)
 of "icons" (images)

John Knox in Scotland

"...embarked on a concerted campaign of iconoclasm—smashing and removing religious images, which they associated with idolatry—and of purging churches of altars, statues, crucifixes, carvings, bells, pictures... They hoped to purify worship by eliminating all considered to be false or detracting from the honor that God alone deserved."

Zwingli in Switzerland

"At the same time there were occurring sporadic outbreaks of iconoclasm in churches in Zurich and outside, much of it intensified by the preaching of Zwingli and his colleague at St. Peter's, Leo Jud."

John Calvin in Geneva

"For Calvin the worship of the medieval church had become 'gross idolatry.' The issue of idolatry was for him as serious as the issue of works-righteousness in justification. The Reformers, like the prophets of old, needed to attack the idolatry and the 'external show' of the worship of their time. The antidote to the theatrics of the church in Calvin's day was a godly simplicity of worship"
