- 2. Read **Revelation 5:9-14**. How should this scene and its participants' clarity regarding the power and authority of Christ alter the way you think of him, as well as the way you think of yourself?
- 3. Read **Philippians 3:4-9**. How does this perspective safeguard us from self-promotion or pride about the fact that Christians are forgiven and accepted by God?
- 4. Read **James 3:13-18**. How would you respond to someone who says that humility is a weakness that "will not work" in our modern world?
- 5. Read **Proverbs 29:23**. What practical steps can you take to be mindful of the importance of keeping yourself in perspective?
