- 4. Read **2 Timothy 2:8-10**. What can you do to keep this continually in view, especially when people are harsh toward you as the messenger of God's truth?
- 5. Read **Galatians 2:11-13**. In what ways have you witnessed the contagious effects of your own compromise and disobedience to the word?
