Luke 15:25 "Now his older son was in the field, and as he came and drew near to the house, he heard music and dancing. 26 And he called one of the servants and asked what these things meant. 27 And he said to him, 'Your brother has come, and your father has killed the fattened calf, because he has received him back safe and sound.' 28 But he was angry and refused to go in. His father came out and entreated him. 29 but he answered his father. 'Look, these many years I have served you, and I never disobeyed your command, yet you never gave me a young goat, that I might celebrate with my friends. 30 But when this son of yours came, who has devoured your property with prostitutes, you killed the fattened calf for him!' 31 And he said to him, 'Son, you are always with me, and all that is mine is yours. 32 It was fitting to celebrate and be glad, for this your brother was dead, and is alive; he was lost, and is found." - 1. Read Romans 1:13-15. Even though Paul was a special emissary of the gospel as a divinely-appointed Apostle, what aspects of this kind of gospel "obligation" do all Christians share? In other words, what biblical case could you make to say that the "average Christian" is called to advance the gospel, not just preachers and missionaries?
- 2. Read Romans 1:16. What are some of the reasons you might be tempted to be ashamed of the gospel? How does one overcome these temptations?
- 3. Read Luke 15:28-32. Assuming you are not the unregenerate, estranged-from-the-father kind of person depicted by this resentful older brother in the parable, what are some of the ways a Christian might regrettably share in the self-focused mindset that prevents him from being engaged in evangelism and kingdom expansion?

4. Read Jude 22-23. How does this passage speak to the urgency of our call to care about the lost people around us?

5. Read Acts 5:27-32. What challenge or motivation do you derive from this passage concerning your resolve to be a good Ambassador of Christ to our generation?
