Application Questions

These questions are provided for your further study and application of today's sermon. Thoughtfully writing out the answers to these questions will help to drive home the point of today's study. It is also helpful when you are able to discuss your answers with others.

- 1. Read **Psalm 103:10-14** and **Hebrews 4:15-16**. How does v.14 in this psalm encourage you, and how is it made even more heartening because of the incarnation?
- Read 1 Thessalonians 4:1-8. How could the verses listed in the first question become an excuse to not take your sanctification seriously and how does 1 Thessalonians 4 help to keep you from making those kinds of excuses?
- 3. Read **Daniel 9:3-19**. What are some of the notable features of Daniel's prayer of repentance that are often missing in the way we "tell God we're sorry"?
- 4. Read **Matthew 6:12-15**. Knowing that the rest of the New Testament is clear that we don't earn our forgiveness, how is it that forgiving others can be described in such emphatic terms?
- 5. Read **Genesis 50:15-21**. How can Joseph's perspective on being sinned against by his brothers become a helpful motivation to forgive wholeheartedly?
