

- 1) General Data
 - 760 BC
 - From South; Sent to Prophesy to the North
 - 9 Chapters



- A. Amos
 - 2) The Times
 - During the Reign of Jeroboam II

 Amos 1:1
- of Judah and in the days of Uzziah king of Judah and in the days of Jeroboam the son of Joash, king of Israel, two years before the earthquake.

- A. Amos
 - 3) The Prophet
 - From Tekoa (11 miles south of Jerusalem)

Amos 7:14-15

I was no prophet, nor a prophet's son, but I was a herdsman and a dresser of sycamore figs. But the LORD took me from following the flock, and the LORD said to me, 'Go, prophesy to my people Israel.'



Amos 9:11


In that day I will raise up the booth of David that is fallen and repair its breaches, and raise up its ruins and rebuild it as in the days of old



Amos 9:14–15 I will restore the fortunes of my people Israel, and they shall rebuild the ruined cities and inhabit them; they

shall plant vineyards and drink their wine, and they shall make gardens and eat their fruit. I will plant them on their land, and they shall never again be uprooted out of the land that I have given them," says the LORD vour God.

- B. Hosea
 - 2) The Times
 - Still During Jeroboam II's reign
 - Continued Spiritual Decline (Worst to date)
 - Last Warning of God before Destruction



- B. Hosea
 - 3) The Prophet
 - Nothing Known outside of this Book
 - Northern Local (many geographic refs.)
 - Uses Varied Names for North:
 - -- "Israel" (original name)
 - -- "Ephraim" (powerful tribe)
 - -- "Samaria" (capital representing whole)

- 3) The Prophet
 - He becomes a Major Part of the Message



- B. Hosea
 - 4) The Message
 - Israel is Like a Persistently Unfaithful Spouse Hosea 1:2–3
 - "Go, take to yourself a wife of whoredom and have children of whoredom, for the land commits great whoredom by forsaking the LORD." So he went and took Gomer"

- B. Hosea
 - 4) The Message
 - Three Children Born (with strange names)

 "Jezree"
 - -- "To Scatter" (the people in judgment)
 - "Lo-Ruhamah"
 - -- "No Mercy" (on the people of Israel)
 - "Lo-Ammi"
 - -- "Not My People" (turning to the South)



- B. Hosea
 - 4) The Message
 - Gomer Leaves Hosea with 5+ kids...

Hosea 3:1-2

"Go again, love a woman who is loved by another man and is an adulteress, even as the LORD loves the children of Israel, though they turn to other gods and love cakes of raisins." So I bought her for fifteen shekels of silver and a homer and a lethech of barley.

Hosea 11:1-4 When Israel was a child, I loved him, and out of Egypt I called my son. The more they were called, the more they went away; they kept sacrificing to the Baals and burning offerings to idols. Yet it was I who taught Ephraim to walk; I took them up by their arms, but they did not know that I healed them. I led them with cords of kindness, with the bands of love, and I became to them as one who eases the yoke on their ws, and I bent down to them and fed them.

 - Promise of Restoration


Hosea 14:7

 - -- In Moses' Day: They Refused Passage
 - -- Continued Antagonism Toward Israel



- A. Obadiah
 - 1) General Data
 - 845 BC
 - Shortest Book in the OT
 - 1 Chapter
 - Earliest of the 16 Writing Prophets



- A. Obadiah
 - 2) The Times
 - Jeremiah, Amos & Joel know of this Prophecy
 - Edom had Attacked Jerusalem
 - -- Obadiah vv.10-14 cp. 2 Kings 8:20-22




- A. Obadiah
 - 3) The Prophet
 - Common Name ("Servant of Yahweh")
 - -- 12 other people in OT = "Obadiah"
 - -- None correspond to this Prophet
 - He Gives no Biographical Information



- A. Obadiah
 - 4) The Message
 - Edom Will Be Judged
 - Their Prideful Confidence is Foolish
 Obadiah 3
 - The pride of your heart has deceived you, you who live in the clefts of the rock, in your lofty dwelling, who say in your heart, "Who will bring me down to the ground?"









- A. Obadiah
 - 4) The Message
 - God & His People Will Rule Over This Land Obadiah 21
 - Saviors shall go up to Mount Zion to rule Mount Esau, and the kingdom shall be the LORD's.



- B. Jonah
 - 1) General Data
 - Sent to Nineveh
 - -- One of the Oldest Cities
 - Genesis 10:8, 11
 - Cush fathered Nimrod; he was the first on earth to be a mighty man. ... From that land he went into Assyria and built Nineveh



- B. Jonah
 - 1) General Data
 - Sent to Nineveh
 - -- One of the Oldest Cities
 - -- Capital of the Assyrian Empire






- B. Jonah
 - 1) General Data
 - Sent to Nineveh
 - -- One of the Oldest Cities
 - -- Capital of the Assyrian Empire
 - 780 BC
 - Sent from the Northern Kingdom of Israel
 - Old Testament 4 Chapters

- B. Jonah
 - 2) The Times
 - Also During the Reign of Jeroboam II
 - -- Relative Peace & Prosperity
 - -- Spiritual Decline
 - Assyria Between Strong Leaders
 - Sinful (but some argue Cautious)





- B. Jonah
 - 3) The Prophet
 - This Book is a Story of the Prophet
 -- cp. to a Record of Prophecy
 - Only one Sentence of Prophecy to Nineveh:

Jonah 3:4

Jonah began to go into the city, going a day's journey. And he called out, "Yet forty days, and Nineveh shall be overthrown!"

- B. Jonah
 - 3) The Prophet
 - A Reluctant Prophet
 - -- For Different Reasons
 - > Disdain for the Assyrians
 - > His Anticipation of God's Mercy
 - Jonah: Most Stubborn Character in the Book



- B. Jonah
 - 4) The Message
 - To the Ninevites: You've Earned God's Justice
 - To the Readers: God is Merciful
 - -- Toward the Assyrians
 - -- Toward Jonah (3:1)
 - To Jonah: You Want Grace For Yourself
 - -- In your Song (ch.2)
 - -- In the Plant (ch.4)

C. Nahum

- 1) General Data
 - Sent to Nineveh
 - 650 BC
 - -- 130 years after Jonah
 - 3 Chapters



C. Nahum

- 2) The Times
 - The North had Fallen to the Assyrians: 721 BC
 - Ashurbanipal was King











- C. Nahum
 - 2) The Times
 - The North had Fallen to the Assyrians: 721 BC
 - Ashurbanipal was King
 - God to Keep Abrahamic Covenant
 - -- "Curse those who dishonor you" (Gen.12)



- C. Nahum
 - 3) The Prophet Nahum 1:1

An oracle concerning Nineveh. The book of the vision of Nahum of Elkosh.

- "Elkosh" ??
- Perhaps from Galilee







- C. Nahum
 - 4) The Message
 - God is Just

Nahum 1:2

The LORD is a jealous and avenging God; the LORD is avenging and wrathful; the LORD takes vengeance on his adversaries and keeps wrath for his enemies.



Nahum 1:6-7 Who can stand before his indignation? Who can endure the heat of his anger? His wrath is poured out like fire, and the rocks are broken into pieces by him. The LORD is good, a stronghold in the day of trouble; he knows those who take refuge in him.



Hebrews 12:25-29 See that you do not refuse him who is speaking. For if they did not escape when they refused him who warned them on earth, much less will we escape if we reject him who warns from heaven.

Therefore let us be grateful for receiving a kingdom that cannot be shaken, and thus let us offer to God acceptable worship, with reverence and awe, for our God is a consuming fire.

Behold, I am against you, declares the LORD of hosts, and I will burn your chariots in smoke, and the sword shall devour your young lions. I will cut off your prey from the earth, and the voice of your messengers shall no longer be heard.

- 4) The Message
 - God's Judgments are Just
 - God Responds to the Realities we Try to Deny Nahum 3:5

Behold, I am against you, declares the LORD of hosts, and will lift up your skirts over your face; and I will make nations look at your hakedness and kingdoms at your shame.

Revelation 3:18–19 I counsel you to buy from me gold refined by fire, so that you may be rich, and white garments so that you may clothe yourself and the shame of your nakedness may not be seen, and salve to anoint your eyes, so that you may see. Those whom I love, I reprove and discipline, so be zealous and repent.
