Now tell me, 4 was the baptism of John from heaven or from man?" 5 And they discussed it with one another, saying, "If we say, 'From heaven,' he will say, 'Why did you not believe him?' 6 But in we say, 'From man,' all the people will stone us to death, for they are convinced that John was a prophet." 7 So they answered that they did not know where it came from. 8 And Jesus said to them, "Neither will I tell you by what authority I do these things." - 3. Read **2 Corinthians 7:8-9**. Describe a situation when it was difficult and even painful for you to sincerely embrace God's truth on a specific matter.
- 4. Read 1 Corinthians 1:18-25. In what situations have you used the excuse of needing more information, more answers, or more confirmation to evade the reality that you were simply not willing to obey God?
- 5. Read **Psalm 40:8**. What sort of prayers and regular spiritual disciplines might be useful in realizing the fulfillment of this godly declaration?
