- 1. Read **Jeremiah 33:11**. Why do think the subject of "giving" is perceived to be such a negative and "heavy" topic in the present state of our world, our culture, and the church subculture?
- 2. Read **Matthew 6:1-4**. Even though the physical manner of giving for Christians today is so different than it was in the first-century on the Temple Mount, why is this warning still an important exhortation for people like us?
- 3. Read Romans 12:1; Luke 14:33; and 2 Corinthians 5:15. How can financial giving to God be a self-deceiving practice when the truth of these three passages is not kept in view?
- 4. Read **1 Chronicles 21:23-26**. How would you attempt to explain the mindset of David in this passage? Why do you think the payment was so important to him?
- 5. Read **2 Corinthians 8:1-7**. What challenges you about your giving when pondering the principles in this passage?
