- 1. Read **Deuteronomy 4:31, 23** and **Psalm 143:5**. Why is "remembering" such an important part of our relationship with God? What is at stake if we do not actively remember the work of Christ on our behalf?
- 2. Read Psalm 111:1-4 and Ephesians 1:7-9 What are some of the practical effects of regularly and thoughtfully pondering the truths described in Ephesians 1:7-9?
- 3. Read 1 Corinthians 10:14-17. With the context necessitating a strong warning to the Corinthians regarding tempting associations in their idol-filled city, how can the implications which Paul draws out regarding the Lord's supper challenge us to remember our most

important alliances as we live each day in our culture?

Read 1 Corinthians 11:27-32. Sadly the Corinthian church had opened the door to all kinds of problems by connecting the practice of the Lord's supper to an ancient version of an all-church potluck. Even though the context may be different, how does this strong call to self-examination help you think rightly when you participate in the Lord's supper?

Read Colossians 3:1-4. What practical steps can you take to keep your mind focused on the present and future realities described in this passage?
