The Jesus Seminar was a group of about 50 critical Biblical scholars and 100 laymen founded in 1985 by Robert Funk that originated under the auspices of the Westar Institute.<sup>[1][2]</sup> The seminar was very active through the 1980s and 1990s, and into the early 21st century.

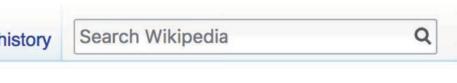
Members of the Seminar used votes with colored beads to decide their collective view of the historicity of the deeds and sayings of Jesus of Nazareth.<sup>[3]</sup> They produced new translations of the New Testament and apocrypha to use as textual sources. They published their results in three reports: The Five Gospels (1993),<sup>[4]</sup> The Acts of Jesus (1998),<sup>[5]</sup> and The Gospel of Jesus (1999).<sup>[6]</sup> They also ran a series of lectures and workshops in various U.S. cities.

Although never formally disbanded, the seminar effectively ceased functioning as "The Jesus Seminar" in 2006, shortly after the 2005 death of its founder Funk. Former Seminarians have carried on the tradition of the Seminar, and continue to publish works researched and developed using the methodologies of the original Jesus Seminar. The Jesus Project was active from 2008 to 2009.
