#### G. Favorite Things

1) Honest & Assertive Ministry 1:10–13 – For there are many who are insubordinate, empty talkers and deceivers, especially those of the circumcision party. They must be silenced, since they are upsetting whole families by teaching for shameful gain what they ought not to teach. One of the Cretans, a prophet of their own, said, "Cretans are always liars, evil beasts, lazy gluttons." This testimony is true. Therefore rebuke them sharply, that they may be sound in the faith



  - For I am already being poured out as a drink offering, and the time of my departure has come. I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith. Paul, an apostle of Christ Jesus by the will of God according to the promise of the life that is in Christ Jesus
- Approximately AD 64 (but before AD 68) SU



# 2. Second TimothyG. Favorite Things1) The War on Timidity

- 1:7 for God gave us a spirit not of fear but of power and love...
  1:8 do not be ashamed of the testimony about our Lord, nor of me his prisoner, but share in suffering for the gospel...
  1:12 I am not ashamed, for I know whom I have believed, and I am convinced that he is able to guard until that day what has been entrusted to me.
- 1:16 Onesiphorus, for he often refreshed me and was not ashamed of my chains





3) Real Bible Ministry (vs. Arguing)

2 Timothy 2:14–15

Remind them of these things, and charge them before God not to quarrel about words, which does no good, but only ruins the hearers. Do your best to present yourself to God as one approved, a worker who has no need to be ashamed, rightly handling the word of truth.



4) Ready to be Useful

2 Timothy 2:20–21

Now in a great house there are not only vessels of gold and silver but also of wood and clay, some for honorable use, some for dishonorable. Therefore, if anyone cleanses himself from what is dishonorable, he will be a vessel for honorable use, set apart as holy, useful to the master of the house, ready for every good work.

5) Insight Into True Opposition

2 Timothy 2:24–26

And the Lord's servant must not be quarrelsome but kind to everyone, able to teach, patiently enduring evil, correcting his opponents with gentleness. God may perhaps grant them repentance leading to a knowledge of the truth, and they may come to their senses and escape from the snare of the devil, after being captured by him to do his will.

But understand this, that in the last days there will come times of difficulty. For people will be lovers of self, lovers of money, proud, arrogant, abusive, disobedient to their parents, ungrateful, unholy...




- 7) The Perennial Need for Exposition
- 2 Timothy 4:1–3

I charge you in the presence of God and of Christ Jesus, who is to judge the living and the dead, and by his appearing and his kingdom: preach the word; be ready in season and out of season; reprove, rebuke, and exhort, with complete patience and teaching. For the time is coming when people will not endure sound teaching, but having itching ears they will accumulate for themselves teachers to suit their own passions

### The General Epistles

- AKA: "The Catholic" Epistles
  - Not as in "Roman Catholic"
  - "Catholic" as in "General" / "Universal"
  - Not Addressed to Specific Places
    - -- Except 2<sup>nd</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> John
  - Named After Authors (Not Recipients)
    - -- Except "Hebrews"



And being fervent in spirit, he spoke and taught accurately the things concerning Jesus, though he knew only the baptism of John.

- Peter the Apostle
- Via an Amanuensis, Silvanus (AKA "Silas")

1 Peter 5:12

By Silvanus, a faithful brother as I regard him, I have written briefly to you, exhorting and declaring that this is the true grace of God.

## 4. First Peter C. Date

- Written from "Babylon"
  - 1 Peter 5:13
  - She who is at Babylon, who is likewise chosen, sends you greetings, and so does Mark, my son.
- Persecution is Likely after Fire of AD 64
- Peter Said to be Martyred in AD 67
- Approximately AD 65



# 4. First Peter D. Recipients

- Stated
  - 1 Peter 1:1b
  - To those who are elect exiles of the Dispersion in Pontus, Galatia, Cappadocia, Asia, and Bithynia
- Broadest "Specific" Addressees in NT
- Diaspora? (Jewish?)





# 4. First Peter E. Purpose

Stand Firm

1 Peter 5:12b

I have written briefly to you, exhorting and declaring that this is the true grace of God. Stand firm in it.

In the Face of Suffering

1 Peter 5:9

Resist him, firm in your faith, knowing that the same kinds of suffering are being experienced by your brotherhood throughout the world.


# 4. First Peter G. Favorite Things

1) Suffering as a Welcomed Test

1 Peter 5:10

And after you have suffered a little while, the God of all grace, who has called you to his eternal glory in Christ, will himself restore, confirm, strengthen, and establish you.





- G. Favorite Things
  - 3) Accept the Right Kind of Persecution 1 Peter 2:12
    - Keep your conduct among the Gentiles honorable, so that when they speak against you as evildoers, they may see your good deeds and glorify God on the day of visitation.

1 Peter 4:15-16

But let none of you suffer as a murderer or a thief or an evildoer or as a meddler. Yet if anyone suffers as a Christian, let him not be ashamed, but let him glorify God in that name.

# 4. First Peter G. Favorite Things

- 4) Sincere Respect for Authority
  - 1 Peter 2:13-14
  - Be subject for the Lord's sake to every human institution, whether it be to the emperor as supreme, or to governors as sent by him to punish those who do evil and to praise those who do good.
  - 3:1 Likewise, wives, be subject to your own husbands, so that even if some do not obey the word, they may be won without a word by the conduct of their wives were a word by the conduct of their wives with the conduct of their wives.

- G. Favorite Things
  - 5) Evidence of Faith in Suffering

1 Peter 2:22-23

He committed no sin, neither was deceit found in his mouth. When he was reviled, he did not revile in return; when he suffered, he did not threaten, but continued entrusting himself to him who judges justly.

1 Peter 3:14-15

But even if you should suffer for righteousness' sake, you will be blessed. Have no fear of them, nor be troubled, but in your hearts honor Christ the Lord as holy, always being prepared to make a defense to anyone who asks you for a reason for the hope that is in you; yet do it with gentleness and respect



- G. Favorite Things
  - 7) It's Lack of Persecution is Surprising

1 Peter 4:12-13

Beloved, do not be surprised at the fiery trial when it comes upon you to test you, as though something strange were happening to you. But rejoice insofar as you share Christ's sufferings, that you may also rejoice and be glad when his glory is revealed.



- G. Favorite Things
  - 7) It's Lack of Persecution is Surprising
    - 1 Peter 4:1-2
    - Since therefore Christ suffered in the flesh, arm yourselves with the same way of thinking, for whoever has suffered in the flesh has ceased from sin, so as to live for the rest of the time in the flesh no longer for human passions but for the will of God.
