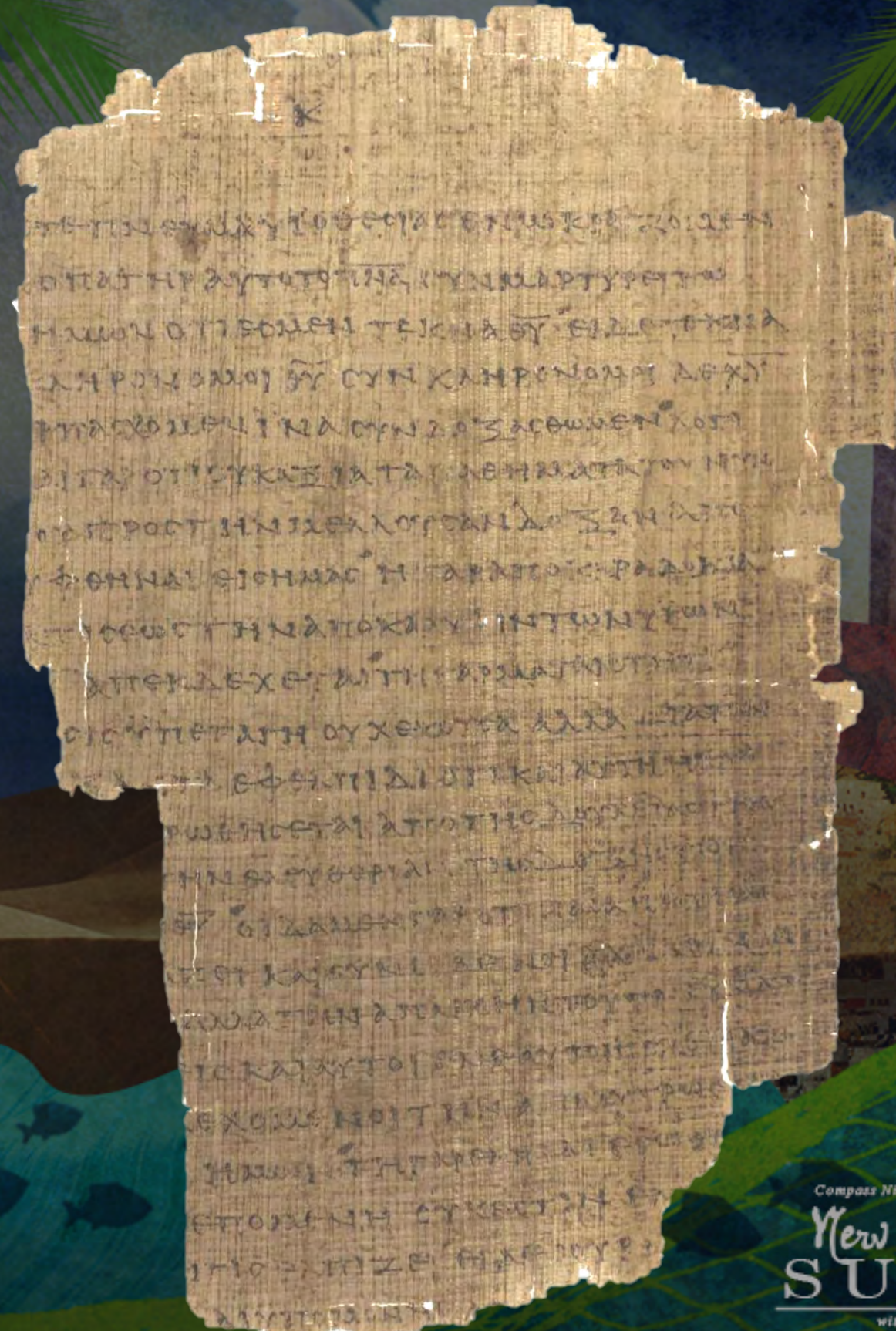

1:10–13 – For there are many who are insubordinate, empty talkers and deceivers, especially those of the circumcision party. 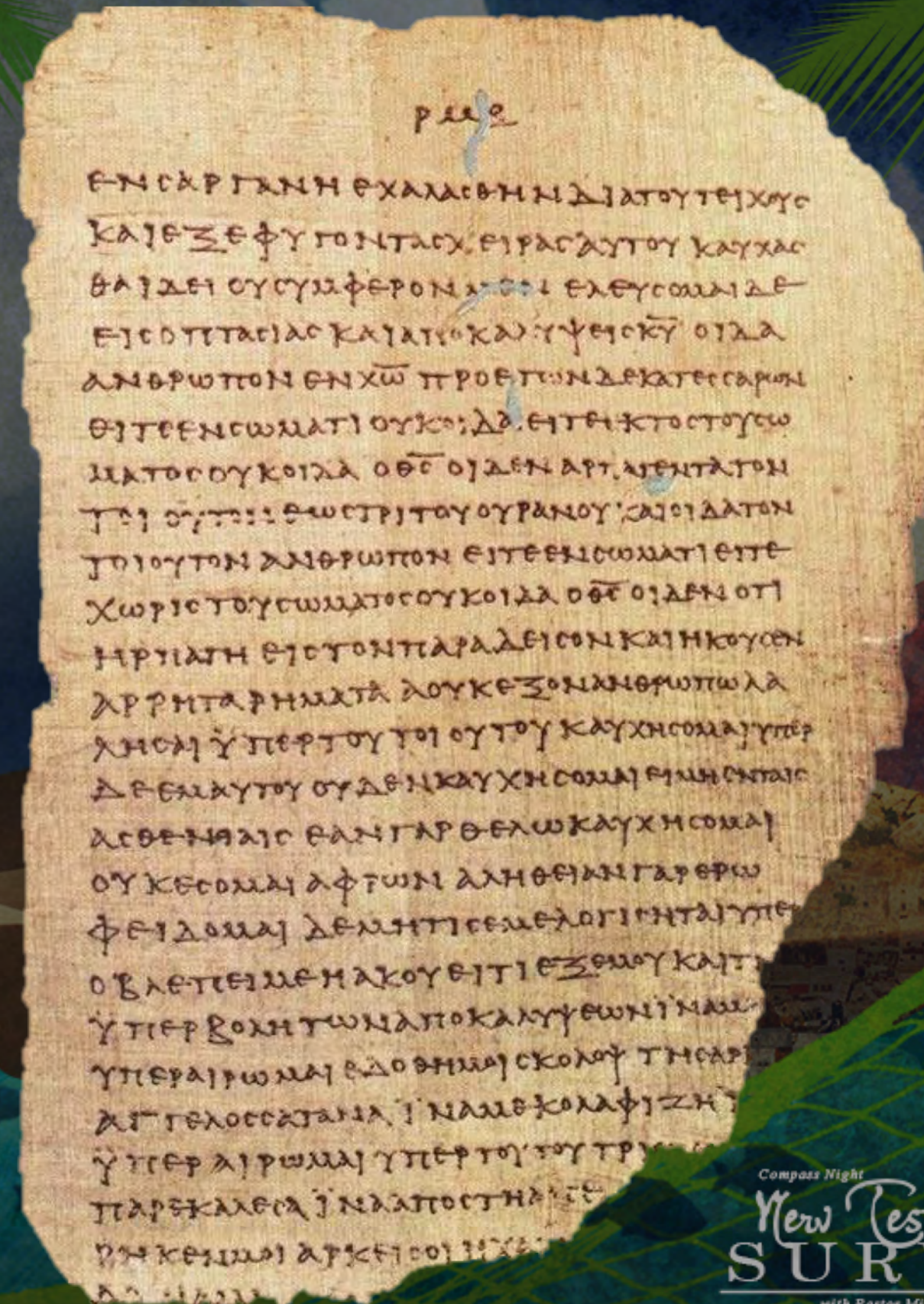

1:7 – for God gave us a spirit not of fear but of power and love...

1:8 – do not be ashamed of the testimony about our Lord, nor of me his prisoner, but share in suffering for the gospel...

1:12 – I am not ashamed, for I know whom I have believed, and I am convinced that he is able to guard until that day what has been entrusted to me.

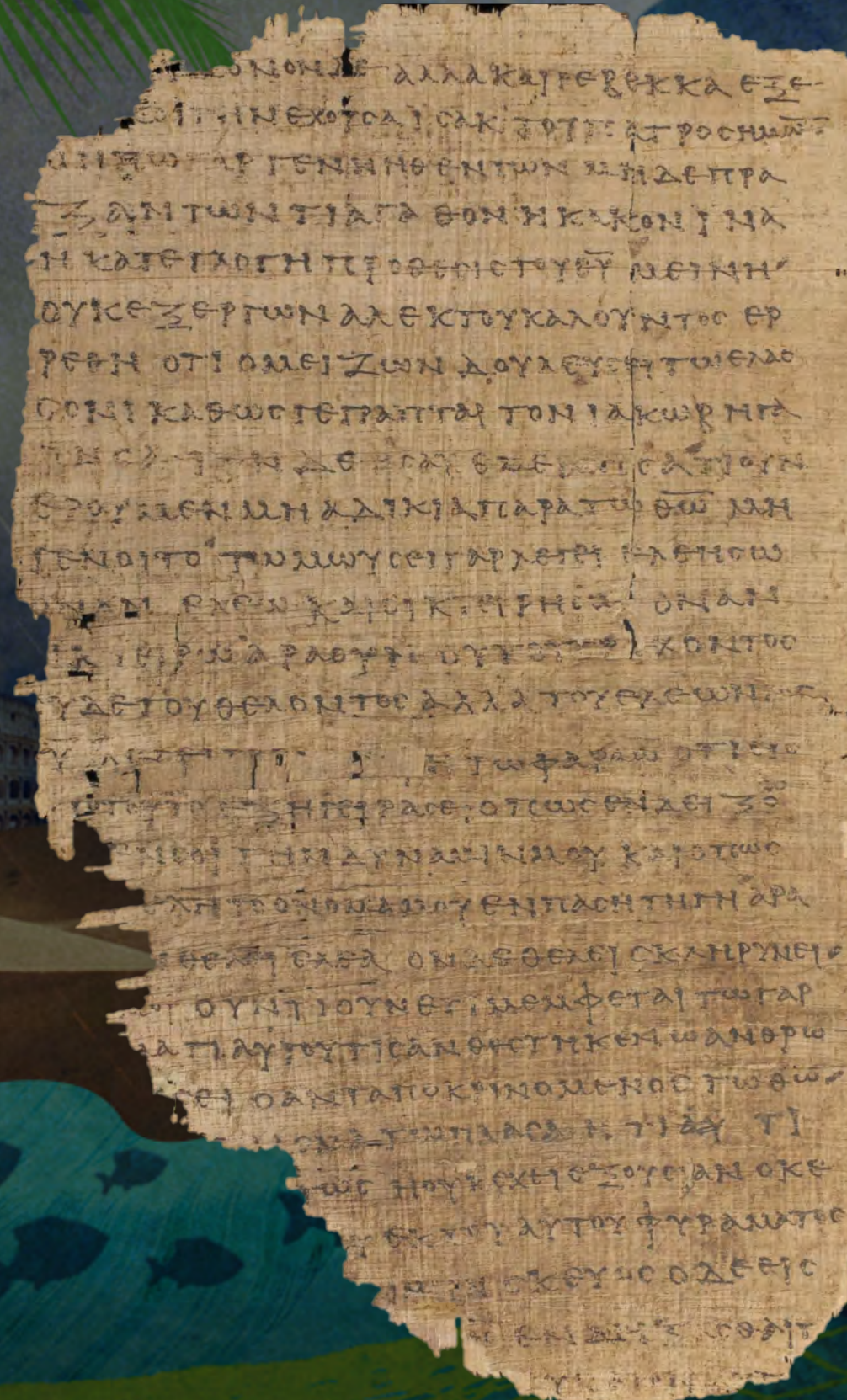
AKA: “The Catholic” Epistles

- Named After Authors (Not Recipients)
 - Except “Hebrews”

She who is at Babylon, who is likewise chosen, sends you greetings, and so does Mark, my son.

- Persecution is Likely after Fire of AD 64
- Peter Said to be Martyred in AD 67
- Approximately AD 65

- Stated

1 Peter 1:1b

To those who are elect exiles of the Dispersion in Pontus, Galatia, Cappadocia, Asia, and Bithynia

- Broadest “Specific” Addressees in NT
- Diaspora? (Jewish?)

I have written briefly to you, exhorting and declaring that this is the true grace of God. Stand firm in it.

- In the Face of Suffering

1 Peter 5:9
