3. Read **1 John 3:14-18**. What are some examples of loving people in practical and costly ways that bring you assurance that God is at work in your life?

4. Read **2 Corinthians 9:15**. Consider what God has done for you. What does pondering the depth of that answer do for your giving, serving, and sacrifice?
