- 2. Read Isaiah 1:2-4 and Psalm 2:1-3. Why do you think people struggle so much with seeing their everyday lives as rebellion against God? Why is "revolt" or "rebellion" an apt description of our waywardness?
- 3. Read 1 Corinthians 15:3. How can the phrase "Christ died for our sins" lose its impact when we fail to see the direct connection between our specific sins and their payment by his death?
- 4. Read **Philippians 3:20-21**. How is our hope in God's promises about eternity bolstered by a more frequent recollection of Christ's immense power? How can you remind yourself of this more often?
