3. Read **Acts 20:22-24**. What keeps most Christians falling short of this mindset? What are the things that keep so many of us valuing our present lives too much?

4. Read **Luke 15:3-7**. How does a serious contemplation of this passage help you to move closer to the frontlines of reaching non-Christians with the gospel?
