- 1. Read **John 3:27** and **John 19:10-11**. Why is the truth found in these passages (i.e., earthly leaders having derived and temporal authority versus inherent authority) so helpful for us as Christians to keep in view as we consider our civil authorities and their actions?
- 2. Read **Psalm 2**. How can the preeminence of the Son of God over all earthly authorities give you peace even if his judgment and accountability of those authorities is delayed?
- 3. Read 1 Timothy 2:1-4 and Daniel 4:34-37. What can you do to more consistently and sincerely pray for your government officials to think and rule as they ought?

4. Read **Philippians 3:20-21**; **Romans 13:1-7** and **1 Corinthians 8:5-6**. What advice would you give a new Christian to wisely navigate the remainder of his or her life as a good and godly citizen of two kingdoms?

5. Read **1 Corinthians 3:16-23** and **1 Timothy 3:14-16**. What sorts of broad and positive impact does the Church have when it is functioning as God intended?
