- 3. Read **Luke 24:45-49**. Why do you think so many Christians fail to explain the urgency or implications of repentance to their non-Christian friends, family, or acquaintances?
- 4. Read **Luke 3:7-14**. How would you respond to someone who says this teaching about repentance is too dramatic and too demanding, and therefore isn't the loving message of real Christianity?
- 5. Read Matthew 13:18-30. How can we all remain hopeful and optimistic about people in our world becoming fruit-bearing Christians, while being mindful and clear about the difference between true and counterfeit responses to the gospel?
