And he said to him, "Your prayers and your alms have ascended as a memorial before God. 5 And now send men to Joppa and bring one Simon who is called Peter. 6 He is lodging with one Simon, a tanner, whose house is by the sea." 7 When the angel who spoke to him had departed, he called two of his servants and a devout soldier from among those who attended him, 8 and having related everything to them, he sent them to Joppa. - 1. Read Acts 9:1-4 and Acts 10:1-2. Here are the two contrasting pre-Christian experiences of Paul and Cornelius. One fought Christ up until being confronted with the gospel, and the other had a long period of being drawn to an increasingly accurate view of God, then heard the gospel. Which was more like your experience and in what way?
- 2. Read Luke 9:57-62 and John 6:26-29. Though Cornelius' pre-Christian experience was impressive, everyone's move toward Christ and the gospel is characterized by varying degrees of selfishness. What were some of the bad motives that you now see looking back on your early days of being drawn to repentance and faith?

3.	Read Romans 10:9-18 . What are your thoughts in response to pondering the fact that God uses your mouth to relay clarifying truths about who he is, what the gospel means, and what people's motives ought to be when calling on him?
