- 2. Read **Luke 1:68-79**. How does this perspective about the first coming of Christ (and John, his forerunner) challenge your perspective on the magnitude of what has already taken place at the incarnation? How can that impact your attitude and perspective more profoundly and more often?
- 3. Read **Nehemiah 8:9-12**. Why are special days in which we purpose to sincerely rejoice in God's redemptive work helpful in affecting our lives in between holidays?
