Application Questions

These questions are provided for your further study and application of today's sermon. Thoughtfully writing out the answers to these questions will help to drive home the point of today's study. It is also helpful when you are able to discuss your answers with others.

- 1. Read **Hebrews 10:23-25**. Christians can forget how important our connection is to our church and its programs. How would you explain to a new Christian the value of a good church and his or her committed involvement in it?
- 2. Read 1 Peter 5:8-9 and Ecclesiastes 4:12. Solomon's principle can be seen in the advantage of the spiritual strength and protection derived from truly integrating into your church. How have you seen this to be true?
- 3. Read Ephesians 4:15-16 and 1 Corinthians 12:14-20. Consider how a body illustrates our interconnectedness as a congregation. What are some of the encouraging benefits for individuals inherent in this imagery?
- 4. Read 1 Thessalonians 2:17-20. Knowing that the Thessalonians Paul speaks of here are as imperfect as any other congregation of Christians, what can you do to work on valuing and cherishing the Christians in your church?
- 5. Read 1 Peter 4:8-11. When you consider all of God's investments in your life as a "stewardship" in light of how you connect and serve in your church, what specific thoughts or convictions come to mind?
