- 1. Read **1 Corinthians 3:1-7.** In what ways might we be tempted to think like the world by being zealous for well-known Christian personalities? How can we guard against letting that mindset divide our local church body like it did at Corinth?
- 2. Read **James 2:1-4.** Besides wealth, what kinds of differences can tempt us to prefer certain people in church over others? Why is this kind of favoritism such a serious offense before God?
- 3. Read **1 Corinthians 1:26-29.** How does it encourage you to know that God handpicked the church family just as he wanted it to be? How can that truth help you form friendships more freely and joyfully?
- 4. Read **1 Corinthians 6:9-11** and **1 John 3:1-4**. How should the reality that God has made every Christian in our church his child elevate your view of them and deepen the way you value them as your family?
- 5. Read **Romans 15:6-7.** Since Christ has welcomed you by His mercy and grace, what specific steps can you take to more fully welcome and deepen fellowship with your brothers and sisters in our church?
