## **Application Questions**

These questions are provided for your further study and application of today's sermon. Thoughtfully writing out the answers to these questions will help to drive home the point of today's study. It is also helpful when you are able to discuss your answers with others.

- 1. Read **Ephesians 6:19–20.** Paul asked for prayer to speak boldly in a hostile world. How does the image of being Christ's ambassador encourage you to represent him with greater confidence?
- 2. Read **Luke 19:10.** Since Jesus' purpose was to seek and save the lost, what practical steps can you take to keep that mission shaping your outlook and priorities this week?
- 3. Read **Ezekiel 18:23, 32; 33:11.** If God has always desired repentance rather than judgment, how do these verses challenge the mistaken idea that the God of the Old Testament is different from the God of the New Testament?
- 4. Read **2 Corinthians 5:20**. How does the thought that it says God himself is appealing through us change the way you think about sharing the gospel? How can that perspective start to dismantle our excuses for being silent?
- 5. Read **2 Corinthians 5:21.** Many people speak of God or Jesus in vague, sentimental, or surface-level ways. What is at stake if we fail to present the core issues of what this verse teaches about sin, substitution, and imputed righteousness?
