## **Application Questions**

These questions are provided for your further study and application of today's sermon. Thoughtfully writing out the answers to these questions will help to drive home the point of today's study. It is also helpful when you are able to discuss your answers with others.

- 1. Read **Psalm 1:1-6.** What specific choices or boundaries does this psalm prompt you to establish so that you can obey 2 Corinthians 6:14–16a and stay useful to God in a compromised world?
- 2. Read **1 John 5:19-21** and **James 4:4-5**. How do these passages about our relationship with the world and with God shape the way you think about your personal alliances and partnerships?
- 3. Read **Ephesians 5:7-17.** Some people object to Paul's command in 2 Corinthians 6 by noting that Jesus spent time with tax collectors and sinners. How does this passage clarify the difference between purposefully engaging unbelievers and partnering with them?
- 4. Read **Romans 12:1-2.** In what ways does Paul's call to present your life as a living sacrifice help you see why guarding your partnerships is a natural and necessary response to God's mercy?
- 5. Read **1 Corinthians 6:19-20.** Since God owns you and dwells within you, why is guarding your partnerships just the beginning of glorifying him, and what other parts of your sanctification deserve the same diligence?
