- 1. Read **1 Timothy 4:7-8.** God's word says godliness is valuable now and forever. Looking back, how have you seen obedience to God's truth pay off in real, practical ways in your life?
- 2. Read **Matthew 6:19-21.** Although Jesus here doesn't describe these heavenly rewards in detail, what about his words makes the pursuit of eternal treasure so motivating, even when we don't fully envision what those rewards will be?
- 3. Read **Psalm 24:3-4.** When you think about the integrity of harmonizing your outward actions and inward thoughts, what challenges come to mind? Why is it often so difficult?
- 4. Read **Ephesians 4:22-24.** What practical steps can you take this week to guard your mind from ungodly influences and to renew your thinking so it reflects more of God's truth?
- 5. Read **Hebrews 12:28-29.** Why do you think we tend to tame or "domesticate" our view of God, and how does recovering a biblical view of his holiness and power reshape your pursuit of godliness?
